#### Aims of prose teaching

**Definition of prose:** According to Coleridge, "Prose is words in their best order. "Poetry and prose are two different forms of literature. Thenature, aims and methods of teaching prose are different from those of poetry. Appreciation of prose involves comprehending the central experiences, beauty and property of the phraseology, the allusions and the images in the preservation of the experiences." Teaching of prose includes two types of lessons: (a) Detailed prose lesson (b) None-detailed prose lesson.

Difference between prose and poetry:

Poetry appeals to the intellect only. Poetry is a more powerful form of expression.

Prose is for more information, whereas poetry is for sheer delight. Poetry is for appreciation. Prose is for knowledge.

Poetry is not to be taught for language practice. It helps the learner to learn natural speech rhythm, whereas prose teaching is to understand new words.

Poetry is sounder than sight. It appeals principally to ear than eye, whereas is more sight than sound, merely pattern on paper.



Prose is designed to improve the vocabulary of the students and develops their sense of language, whereaspoetry is taught to train their aesthetic sense.

Prose appeals teacher's concentration on making thepupils grasp all language items such as vocabulary. But in teaching of a poetry, teacher need not to do it.

**Aims of prose teaching:** There is only one object of teaching prose that the children may be able to understand the vocal and written ideas of the persons.

The aims can be divided into two categories (1) simpleaims (2) special aims.

**Simple aims:** The simple aims can be sub-divided into a number of topics

- Addition to the vocabulary.
- Capacity to assimilate the ideas.
- Correct pronunciation.
- > Develops a good habit of paying attention to any speaker of English prose.
- ➢ Correct reading.
- > Develops both a sense of confidence and achievement.
- Development of silent reading.
- Proper use of knowledge in life.
- Capacity for conversation.
- Development of mental faculties.
- Develop writing skills properly.
- > The use of read stories to explain their expression at large.
- Introduction of the life of various writers.
- > To enable the students to read extensively.
- > To develop creative faculties.
